<p>Very Good</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The purpose and objectives for the proposed work are outlined and mostly align with the award objectives. 	<p>3.5 – 3.9</p> <p>may be funded</p>



<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The description of the proposed work provides a general picture of the proposed activity, tool or product; the benefits to the target audience are described and will ensure that some uptake of relevant knowledge occurs. • The primary outcomes/outputs are outlined in some detail, providing a suitable process for how to measure and evaluate them. • The application includes a reasonable plan for how researchers and research users will engage in the co-development and implementation of the proposed work. • The trainee plays an important supporting role in the project; the application includes a reasonable plan for KT capacity-building. 	
<p>Fair</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The purpose and objectives of the proposed work are included, but with modest detail, and are only somewhat aligned with the award objectives. • The application provides an overly-generalized outline of the proposed work; the benefits to the target audience from the dissemination activity appear to be minimal and incongruent with the proposed work. • The primary outcomes/outputs are vaguely outlined, providing only limited detail for a process to measure and evaluate them. • The application includes only a vague outline for how researchers and research users will engage in the co-development and implementation of the proposed work. • The trainee plays only a background role in the proposed work with modest participation; the application includes a minimal plan for KT capacity-building that lacks specifics. 	<p>3.0 – 3.4</p> <p>not fundable</p>
<p>Less than Adequate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The purpose and objectives of the proposed work are either not included or severely lack appropriate detail. • The description of the proposed work provided is poorly written and lacks suitable details; specific audiences have not been identified and little to no tangible benefit of the dissemination activity, or its potential impact is indicated. • The primary outcomes/outputs are not clearly listed, with no discernable details on how they are to be measured or evaluated. • The application includes no clear plan for how researchers and research users will engage in the co-development and implementation of the proposed work. • The trainee does not play a meaningful role in the project; the application does not include any plan for KT capacity-building. 	<p>0.0 – 2.9</p> <p>not fundable</p>

<p>Outstanding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The format and content of the dissemination activity is extremely effective and perfectly tailored to the intended target audience. • The research evidence to be disseminated is supported by a highly reputable and high-impact body of work. • The role and participation of researcher and research user team members are appropriate, well-described and highly justified for the proposed dissemination activity. • The requested budget is perfectly aligned and justified for the proposed work. • The work plan is exceptionally well-crafted, with clearly defined milestones and deliverables that are highly achievable within the proposed timeframe. 	<p>4.5 – 4.9 may be funded</p>

<p>Fair</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The format and content of the dissemination activity is somewhat tailored to the intended target audience, but its effectiveness is questionable. The research evidence to be disseminated is partially supported by a relatively small body of work with limited impact. The role and participation of researcher and research user team members are described in some detail, but lack clear justification for their inclusion in the proposed work. The requested budget is somewhat appropriate for the proposed work, but lacks clear justification and detail. The proposed work plan is provided, but in limited detail, providing milestones and deliverables of questionable feasibility within an ambiguous timeframe. 	<p>3.0 – 3.4</p> <p>not fundable</p>
<p>Less than Adequate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> The format and content of the dissemination activity is ineffective and not appropriate for the intended target audience. The research evidence to be disseminated is generally unsupported by a relevant body of work, making it highly questionable. The role and participation of researchers and research user team members are described in limited detail, and lack clear justification for their inclusion in the proposed work. The requested budget is inappropriate for the proposed work and lacks clear justification and detail. The proposed work plan is poorly written, lacking specific milestones and deliverables, and is of dubious feasibility within the timeframe of the award. 	<p>0.0 – 2.9</p> <p>not fundable</p>

The application describes how the continued engagement between researcher and research users will be monitored and/or continue past the award term.

<p>Outstanding</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The proposed dissemination activity, tool or product is extremely relevant to, and will positively impact the health of British Columbians and/or the BC health system. • The proposed dissemination activity, tool or product has a high likelihood of informing and/or improving further health research, practice and/or policy. • A clear and practical plan is described to ensure that meaningful and productive collaborations between researchers and research users continue past the award term. 	<p>4.5 – 4.9</p> <p>may be funded</p>

<p>Very Good</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The proposed dissemination activity is generally relevant to, and has some potential to impact the health of British Columbians and the BC health system. • The proposed dissemination activity will inform and/or improve further health research, practice and/or policy to some extent. • A general process is described, for continuing the collaboration between researchers and research users following the end of this funding opportunity, but it lacks some specific detail. 	<p>3.5 – 3.9</p> <p>may be funded</p>
<p>Fair</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The proposed dissemination activity is of limited interest and relevance to, and will have a limited impact on the health of British Columbians and the BC health system. • The proposed dissemination activity may facilitate the use of some research evidence to inform and/or improve further health research, practice and/or policy. • A vague plan is included that outlines possible future collaborations between researchers and research following the end of this funding opportunity, but is generally lacking in detail. 	<p>3.0 – 3.4</p> <p>not fundable</p>
<p>Less than Adequate</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The proposed dissemination activity is generally irrelevant to, and will have no impact on the health of British Columbians and the BC health system. • It is highly unlikely the proposed dissemination activity will inform and/or improve further health research, practice and/or policy. • There is little-to-no indication that the collaboration between researchers and research users will continue past the award term. 	<p>0.0 – 2.9</p> <p>not fundable</p>
